Resilient Architecture and Community Design (RAC-D)	13/9/2019	18/9/2019	This 3-day workshop began on 14 th September 2019 in Tha-Chalom area where students explored the site, local climate, and identified problems in this area. Groups of Thai and Indonesian students were assigned to redesign the community between the Ban Laem railway station and the Tha-Chalom pier, where the transit spot is for travelers heading to the Umbellar market, Samutsongkram. During the workshop, our collaboration team was kindly supported by the Samutsakhon city development (Social Enterprise), which provided information and history about Tha-Chalom in Baan Tha-Chalom tourist information center. On 15 th - 16 th September at Faculty of Architecture, Kasetsart University, students were assigned as internationally mixed groups to redesign the Tha-Chalom community with their collected information. In their design, students needed to consider sustainability requirements, disaster proof (flood proof), requirements of Thai building regulations, and consideration of economic situation. During the workshop, students received valuable comments from both Indonesian and Thai lecturers for their design improvement. These works will be continued as their final projects in 2 th year architectural studio. After student workshop, lecturers from three universities discussed about future research collaboration which aims to study the habitat transformation and climate change adaptation in Asian.
